- All 9th graders took quarterly field trips into the community to support the theme of LEADS in using the community as a classroom.

 - Trip 3: Aerospace & Automotive Museums, Balboa Park
 - Trip 4: Art Museums, Balboa Park
- February 2005: 12 Seniors crossed to neighboring City College to begin their college education.
- College Tour: day trip to UC Santa Barbara and UC Riverside, May 18, 2005
- May 2005: 100% of the 11th graders went to City College to take the entrance exam so they would be able to start classes in Fall 2005 (as seniors) if their schedule permitted.
- 100% of the senior class passed their Senior Exhibitions
- 100% of the senior class graduated
- Spring 2005 College Trip: college trip, April 13th – 17th, 2005
- Attendance: 04-05 hovers above the District average
- Study Skills: class created for 20 least successful students to intervene and offer support and learning strategies; every student enrolled in the class improved grades from having 4 F’s to having no more than 1 F increasing their grades to C or better in 3 or more classes.
- Graduates: 92.5% of graduating seniors entered a college or vocational school following graduation
